THE MARABI *CLUB*

Superb contemporary food, slick service, interiors that conjure Joburg in an earlier age and a moodily-lit stage on which a jazz band plays come together at this underground restaurant in a downtown location. 
THE WESTCLIFF'S GUIDE TO MUST-SEE MUSEUMS

Joburg is a relatively young city, founded in 1886 when gold was discovered. Despite its young age, Joburg has a rich and turbulent history and there are excellent museums dedicated to the most pivotal moments of South African history, particularly the struggle to end apartheid, that were shaped by this city. For those looking to understand South Africa's past and present, Joburg has some of the finest museums which explore the country's history from multiple angles.











APARTHEID MUSEUM

An extraordinary and extensive museum that brings to life the horror of apartheid: from petty cruelties inflicted on the everyday lives of black South Africans to mass state repression and violence. South Africa's long struggle for democracy and freedom is compellingly told with powerful displays, archival footage and interactive elements that bring the stories of historical leaders and everyday people to the fore.

CONSTITUTION HILL

The buildings of the national heritage landmark Constitution Hill in Braamfontein reveal some of the darkest hours of 20th Century South Africa, while also showcasing the bright future of the country enshrined in the modern Constitutional Court. Engaging exhibits tell the stories of the hill's inhabitants (Nelson Mandela was once imprisoned here), complemented by regular temporary exhibitions and an outstanding art collection inside the Court building.

DITSONG NATIONAL MUSEUM OF MILITARY HISTORY

This sprawling museum opened in 1947 details major conflicts from South Africa's history such as the Anglo-Zulu Wars, the Anglo-Boer Wars, South Africa's role in the First and Second World Wars and the resistance movements that fought against Apartheid. Technological developments in warfare are illustrated with a large collection of combat uniforms and weapons on display and most impressively a display of military vehicles that even include a one-man submarine.

HECTOR PIETERSON MUSEUM AND MEMORIAL

On June 16, 1976 Soweto school pupils took to the streets to protest against the abysmal standard of the apartheid-sanctioned Bantu education system. The peaceful protest ended in bloodshed. The police opened fire killing and wounding scores of unarmed students, and riots ensued across the country. This museum is named after one of the first schoolchildren killed by the police on that day, and with startling pictures, personal testimonies and videos provides an in-depth explanation of what became known as the Soweto uprising.




JOHANNESBURG HOLOCAUST & GENOCIDE CENTRE

This museum and centre of memory and dialogue draws parallels between the historical narratives of the genocide committed by Nazi Germany and the genocide that occurred in Rwanda in 1994. Survivors from both the Holocaust and the Rwandan genocide have been deeply involved in shaping the centre. The permanent exhibition is a powerful exploration of genocide in 20th century world history told through photography, film, personal testimonies and everyday personal effects left behind by victims.

MAROPENG AND *STERKFONTEIN CAVES*

Maropeng is the visitor's centre for the Cradle of Humankind UNESCO World Heritage Site. It houses a modern exhibition that takes an interactive approach to the history of life as we know it from the Big Bang to the evolution of humankind and the spread of people across continents. The stories behind the numerous discoveries made here are also showcased alongside copies of the original fossils. A perfect accompaniment is a guided tour of the nearby Sterkfontein Caves where the remains of famous fossils were found. Around 40 minutes drive from Joburg.

ORIGINS CENTRE

This insightful, and high-tech museum at Joburg's Wits University campus in Braamfontein explores and celebrates the history of modern humans, tracing the emergence of humanity along an 80 000-year path to its African source. An extensive collection of ancient rock art and other artefacts details the culture and beliefs of South Africa's first people, the ancient San and Khoi, whose unique way of life was destroyed with the arrival of colonialism.

NELSON MANDELA HOUSE

Nelson Mandela lived in this humble Sowetan 'matchbox' house with his second wife and fellow anti-apartheid activist, Winnie, in the late 1950s and early 1960s. In order to make the house into a museum, the garden has been concreted over and photos and text added to the walls andthe garage is now the ticket hall. Inside, the small rooms are filled with memorabilia belonging to the pair including letters, gifts and awards, as well as some original items of furniture. A small museum, a visit will not take much longer than 20 minutes.

WORKER'S *MUSEUM*

The Newtown workers' compound was built in 1913 for male African migrant workers employed by the nearby power station. The compound has since been made into an excellent and compact museum that uses photographs and personal testimonies to illustrate the hardships, dangers and humiliation faced by migrant workers. The role of migrant workers in South Africa's struggle for equality is well-documented as are the many difficulties faced by the migrant workforce today.




